

o you think you can find the perfect home? TV host and choreographer Mary Murphy did in San Diego — but it wasn't easy.

"I always wanted a ranch home and I've never been able to have one. I was searching for months and driving my real estate agent nuts!" the So You Think You Can Dance judge shares with Closer. "I'd circled around to this house three times over a six-month period, and finally it came down to a price range I was happy with." But, she adds, "It came bare — no shutters, no gutters, no grass, sitting on dirt, but I knewithad potential."

Leading up to the gate of her front courtyard, the 56-year-old started by creating the stone pathway and the little rolling hills to give the place "a storybook feel." 
